

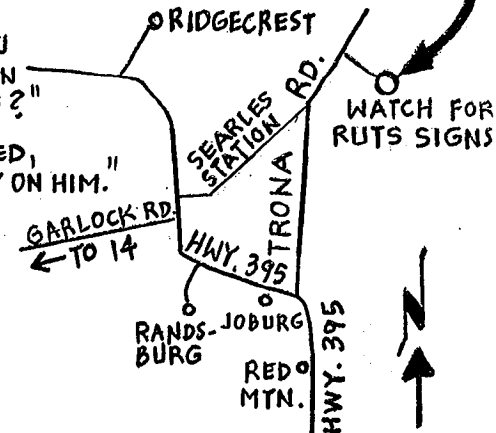

\* Riders Helping Riders is a sub-committee of the American Motorcyclist Association. District 37 Off-Road Amateur Competition, which is comprised of over 20 off-road racing clubs. The RHR Committee oversees a fund that was created to assist riders who are injured in a District 37 AMA sanctioned event. With this fund, RHR helps seriously injured D37 riders while they are recovering from their injuries. RHR pays it forward by helping with house payments, groceries, medical expenses, utility bills, whatever the rider needs during recovery. Money has also been used for after care such as rehab, wheelchair ramps and modifying homes to be ADA compliant. In extreme cases, the money helps to cover the cost of funeral expenses.
